Position of the Polish People's Republic in Eastern Bloc in the context of the events in 1968

As a result of the Polish October Revolution the leadership of the Polish United People's Party was taken by Władysław Gomułka. The Polish People's Republic obtained special status in Eastern Block. The main aim of paper will evaluate international position of Poland in Eastern Block. The analysis will be concentrated on the March events and the Prague Spring. The thesis of paper is that even though the emergence of division in Eastern Block (i.a. loosen dependence on the Soviet Union by Romania), Poland took conservative position in 1968. The paper will be concentrated on creation of the list of reason, which was affected the start of anti-Semitic campaign or decision on intervention of Warsaw Pact in Czechoslovakia by the Polish People's Army. New leader of Czechoslovakia (Dubček) presented a different approach than Gomułka. It is hard to avoid of comparison on those attitude. In order to rigorously develop the paper, it is necessary to review materials such as official statements incumbents and press release, which are the primary sources of information about international relations (i.a. Zaciskanie pętli. Tajne dokumenty dotyczące Czechosłowacji) and the works of other historians (e. g. J. Eisler, Marzec 1968).
