### **Robert Havemann-Revisionit in the GDR**

Robert Havemann was said to be the most prominent enemy of the communist regime /among scholars/ in the GDR. Therefore, this conference paper will cover R. Havemann's position towards the communist regime in the GDR since Stalin's death. This paper will be mainly focused on his life since 1964 when he was excluded from the SED because of his opinions which he presented to students during lectures at the university in Berlin. Thereafter he was banned to work as a scholar and had to live in house arrest. Nevrttheless, he continued to publish ant-regime essays, articles and books which were also available in the Federal Republic of Germany. The author of this paper will use these critical works to show how he criticised communism in the GDR and in the Eastern Bloc.
